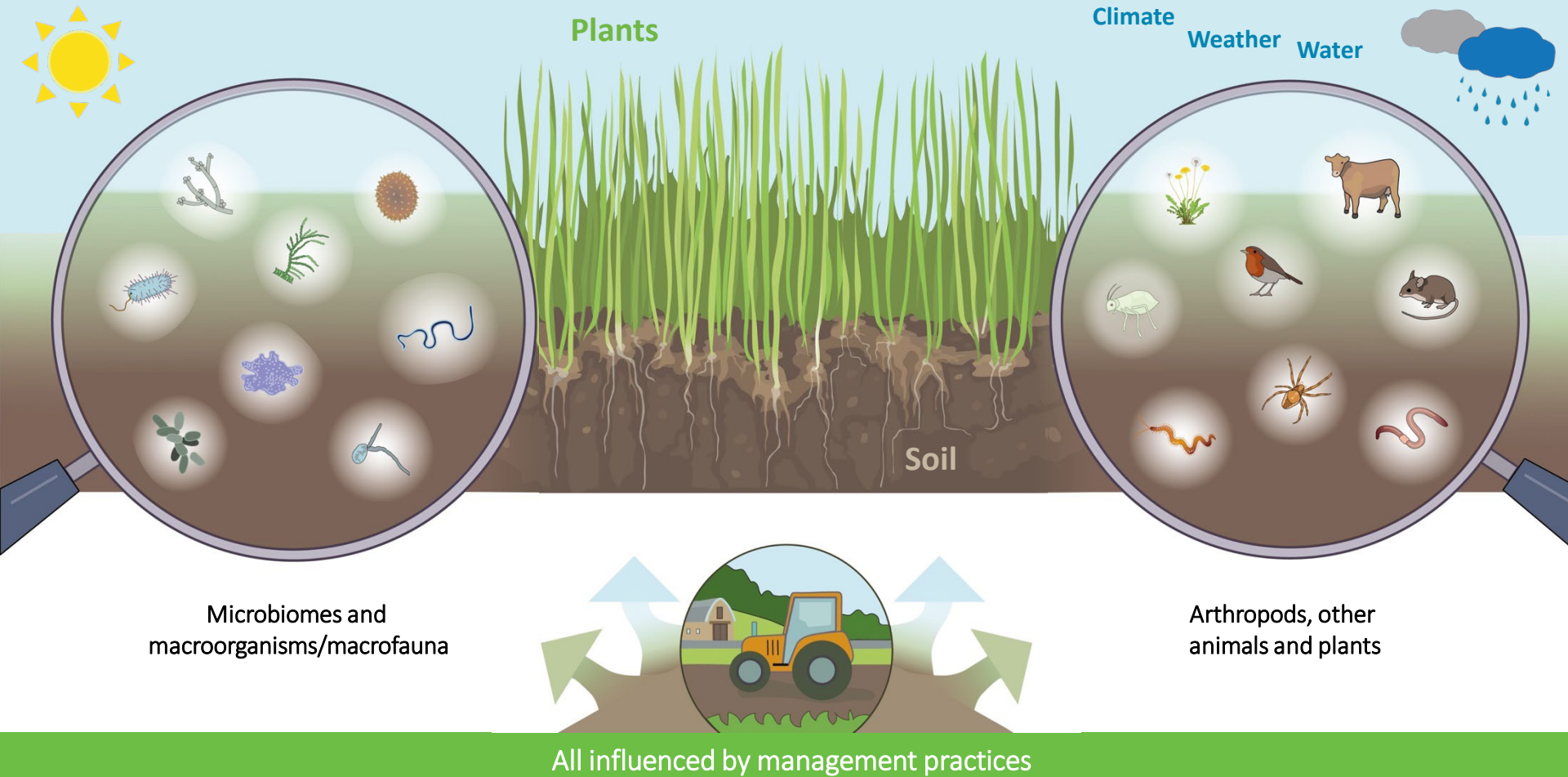

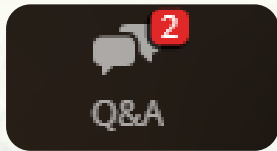


Vertical Farm

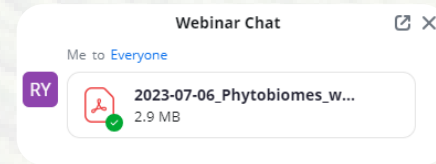
